This training is targeted to all school staff such as teachers integration aides and school nurses

The first 60 minutes focuses on what is epilepsy, the possible impact on students with epilepsy and how to support the student should a seizure occur at school. The final 30 minutes is targeted to key staff as identified by the school (eg. classroom teacher, nurse etc). We focus more on the learning implications, Epilepsy Management Plan, and strategies to support the student.

- Recognise seizure and post-seizure activity and provide appropriate support
- Review and Implement the Epilepsy Management Plan (EMP)
- Develop an inclusive approach to supporting a student with epilepsy

- Key facts about epilepsy and children
- What is epilepsy – what is a seizure?
- Different types of seizures
- Possible behavioural impacts
- Safety
- Student specific support needs
- Seizure first aid

- Possible learning implications
- Epilepsy Smart School approach
- The importance of the Epilepsy Management Plan (EMP)
- Review the EMP
